The "Radio Station" is Classic FM.
2. Anyone who enters the Competition (an "Entrant") will be deemed to have understood these Rules along with the Terms and Conditions and will be bound by them. The Terms and Conditions are available on request from the Radio Station.

DETAILS OF THE COMPETITION:

3. The Classic FM Music Teacher of the Year Awards aim to recognise the nation's most inspirational music teachers. An entry to the competition comprises a completed entry form, accompanied by a CD or DVD of a musical performance by students taught by the nominee and is signed by the nominee and the nominating party. The initial online form asking for nominators to register their interest in the competition does not constitute an entry.
 - 3.1. Completed entry forms and CDs/DVDs must be sent to 30 Leicester Square, London, WC2H 7LA. Complete entries must be received by 09.00 1st October 2014 – entries received after this date will not be entered into the competition. Global Radio does not accept responsibility for late entries or delays in the post.
4. CDs and DVDs themselves must be clearly labeled with the name and contact details of the nominee as well as the case in which they are enclosed. Unfortunately, entries cannot be returned.
5. Copyright in any original work(s) embodied in the CD and/or DVD submitted will remain with the owner. By submitting a CD and/or DVD to Classic FM, you warrant that: (i) you control all copyright and all other rights (including, without limitation, performers' rights) in and to such audio and/or audio visual recording(s) embodied on the CD and/or DVD ("Recording(s)"); and (ii) confirm the grant by you to Classic FM of a worldwide, perpetual, royalty free licence in the copyright and all other rights in and to the Recording(s) (including, without limitation, performers' rights) and you waive any moral rights and like rights you have in relation to the Recording(s); so that Classic FM shall be entitled to use the Recording(s) in any and all media at no cost to Classic FM and such use shall not infringe the rights of any third party.
6. There are five categories: Primary School Music Teacher / Secondary School Music Teacher / Peripatetic/Private Music Teacher / Special Education Needs Music Teacher / Lifetime Achievement Award
The judges reserve the right to make a further award for an exceptional entrant drawn from any of the aforementioned categories. This shall be referred to as the Judges' Award.
7. Full entries must be received by the closing date - 18:00 on 1st October 2014. Classic FM is not responsible for delays in the post. It is recommended that entries be sent by recorded post.
8. The category winners will be those music teachers who have shown through their entries that they have made the greatest difference to the musical life of their students. If the judges are unable to declare a winner for a category due to non entry then they have the right not to award the prize. The judges' decision will be final and no further correspondence will be entered into.
9. The judging panel will be selected by Classic FM.
10. The winning music teachers and their entries may be used by Classic FM, Yamaha, Avid, the Musicians' Union and Music for Youth in publicity relating to the competition. They and their entries may be featured on Classic FM, the competition website, in interviews, photographs and other media.
11. Classic FM will notify the winners via telephone or e-mail of their selection following judging within three weeks after the closing date.
12. The winners will be presented with their prize at the Music for Youth Schools Prom at the Royal Albert Hall, London between the 10-12 November 2014.

ELIGIBILITY:

13. The Classic FM Music Teacher of the Year Awards are open to all UK schools-based music teachers, peripatetic music teachers and private music teachers.
14. For the purposes of this competition, in England, Wales and Northern Ireland, 'Primary schools' are those teaching Key Stage Two classes and below. 'Secondary schools' are those teaching Key Stage Three classes and above, as recognised by the Department for Education. In Scotland, 'Primary schools' are those teaching P7 classes and below. 'Secondary schools' are those teaching S1 classes and above, as recognised by the Scottish Government. A 'Peripatetic/Private Music Teacher' includes those hired by a Music Service or directly by a school or pupil to provide instrumental, vocal and music training for children and adults, either in a school, college, private or community-based setting.
15. Nominees must be a resident of the United Kingdom. Employees of Global Radio, Yamaha, Avid, the Musicians' Union, their families, press, agencies or any persons directly or indirectly connected with this Competition are not eligible to enter the Competition. Global Radio reserves the right to verify the eligibility of all entrants.

PRIZE:

16. Each category winner will receive up to £2,000 at retail value (inc.VAT) worth of Yamaha musical instruments and equipment. Winners will also receive up to £1,000 at retail value (incl. VAT) worth of music software from Avid's Sibelius music education range. Winners can choose any combination of Sibelius, Sibelius First, Auralia, Musition, PhotoScore Ultimate and AudioScore Ultimate. The Yamaha and Avid prizes must be selected by the 27th February 2015.
17. In addition to the above prizes, the winner of the Peripatetic/Private Music Teacher category will also receive:
 - 17.1. Musicians' Union (MU) membership for one year worth £183. If the winner is already a member of the MU they will be able to get their last year's subscription refunded. For those who do not have MU membership, their one year membership will start from the date of when they make the application;
 - 17.2. Bespoke Careers advice session at Musicians' Union HQ. Winner will get the chance to get a one-on-one advice session from an MU official on a topic(s) of their choice;

- 17.3. The opportunity to have a feature on them on both the MU and Musicteachers.co.uk website;
- 17.4. A resource pack from the MU which includes a Teachers' Toolkit and Practice Diaries which have been produced in conjunction with Paul Harris and published by Faber.
18. The competition organisers will pay for travel expenses and accommodation for the winner and a guest. Travel and accommodation will be organised by the promoter and at the promoter's discretion.
 - 18.1. Hotel accommodation will be one double or twin room only, at the five star hotel, Radisson Blu Edwardian Leicester Square. This will be for the evening that the winner is presented with their award. The hotel accommodation includes breakfast only – lunch and evening meals will not be provided. In the event that the Radisson Blu Edwardian is unable to provide accommodation, alternative accommodation of an equal standard will be offered.
 - 18.2. Please note that travel will be in economy class only. Private cars will be arranged to transport the winners between the Radisson Blu Edwardian and the Royal Albert Hall on the evening of the awards. All other travel costs will be incurred by the award winner.
19. At the discretion of the judging panel, up to a further 18 entrants will receive a "Highly Commended" certificate from Classic FM.
20. Prizes are non-exchangeable, non-refundable and for the exclusive use of the winning teacher, their school or music service. No cash alternative will be given.
21. Global Radio reserves the right to substitute the prize with another prize at its absolute discretion.
